CONCEPTNOTE

Gender sensitization is vital for an equitable legal framework, addressing systemic biases in policies, enforcement, and judicial interpretation. The National Conference on Reproductive Rights & Policy Transformation, organized by the Karnataka Institute for Law and Parliamentary Reform (KILPAR) in collaboration with the Gender Studies Committee, School of Law, CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Bangalore, aims to bridge academic research and policy recommendations on gender-related legal issues.

The Conference will critically evaluate legal frameworks, judicial interpretations, and policy implementation while exploring contemporary challenges like digital gender-based violence, gender-neutral laws, and international conventions in Indian jurisprudence. It promotes interdisciplinary approaches, integrating insights from sociology, psychology, and human rights advocacy to develop inclusive legal reforms. Providing a platform for scholars, policymakers, practitioners, and students, it seeks to identify legal gaps and drive progressive reforms to ensure gender justice.





We invite single as well as co-authored Research Papers from students, scholars and academicians interested in the subject-matter.

THEMES:

1. Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) and Reproductive Rights

- Legal and ethical dimensions of abortion laws in India, particularly under the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act, 1971 (amended in 2021).
- Access to safe abortion services, the autonomy of pregnant individuals in decision making, the role of healthcare providers, and the challenges in implementing MTP laws.
- Debate on the gestational limit, abortion for unmarried women, and judicial intervention in abortion cases.

2. Surrogacy Laws and the Rights of Surrogate Mothers

- Impact of the Surrogacy (Regulation) Act, 2021on intended parents, surrogate mothers, and the rights of children born through surrogacy.
- Commercial v. altruistic surrogacy, the inclusion/exclusion of LGBTQIA+72 and single parents.
- Potential reforms to make surrogacy laws more inclusive and balanced.





THEMES:

3. Legal Challenges in Artificial Reproduction

- Emerging medical technologies such as womb implantation and artificial wombs: legal implications on reproductive rights, parental rights, and gender norms.
- Potential amendments in Indian surrogacy and reproductive laws to address these futuristic medical developments.
- Fertility preservation: egg freezing, embryo storage, and their usage in cases of disputes (e.g., divorce or death of a partner): ethical and legal questions

4. LGBTQIA+ 72 Parenthood and Assisted Reproductive Technologies (ART)

- Legal hurdles faced by LGBTQ+ individuals in accessing reproductive services
- Evolving definitions of parenthood and international best practices in inclusive reproductive rights.





THEMES:

5. Consent and Bodily Autonomy in Reproductive Healthcare

- Importance of informed consent in medical procedures such as abortion, sterilization, and assisted reproduction.
- Role of the judiciary in upholding reproductive choices as a fundamental right under Article 21 of the Constitution.
- Reproductive Autonomy in Personal Laws

6. Reproductive Health and Workplace Rights

- Workplace discrimination based on reproductive choices,
- Effectiveness of the Maternity Benefit Act
- Need for paternity leave to promote gender equality in caregiving responsibilities.





SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- 1. All submissions must be made in English. The word limit for the abstract is 300 words (exlcuding keywords), and should be accompanied by 5 keywords.
- 2. All submissions should be made in (.doc) or (.docx) format, and should be formatted in Times New Roman font style, font size 12, with 1.5 line-spacing, on A4-sized paper, with 1-inch margins on all sides.
- 3. Abstracts should clearly mention the title of the proposed paper, the central idea of the paper and the research method to be applied in brief.
- 4. All submissions must be original. If you want your submission to be considered for publication in the edited volume of the Centre, kindly ensure that it is not being considered for another publication simultaneously.
- 5. Every abstract must be accompanied by a cover letter containing the name, affiliation, address and contact details (including the name & phone number) of the author(s). If there is more than one author, details of co-authors should also be mentioned.
- 6. The abstracts must be mailed to the following email address: 'genderstudiescommittee@law.christuniversity.in'.





SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- 7. The email containing the communication of acceptance of abstracts will comprise a Google form link for registration, along with the deadline for registration.
- 8. The paper must be original and free from plagiarism.
- 9. The length of the full paper, including tables, diagrams, illustrations, references, etc., should be between 3000 to 6000 words.
- 10. Headings should be in Times New Roman, font size 14, bold, center-aligned, with 1.5-line spacing.
- 11. Subheadings should use Times New Roman, font size 13, italicized, with 1.15- line spacing.
- 12. Footnotes must be in Times New Roman, font size 10, with single-line spacing.
- 13. Papers should be accompanied by a cover page containing the name of the author(s), affiliation, address and contact details.
- 14. The citation style shall be Bluebook (21st Edition).
- 15. A maximum of one co-author is allowed per paper. All co-authors are required to register for the seminar.
- 16. The submission must not contain more than 10% plagiarized content.

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
ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF PARTCIPATION
