- Word Limit: 3000-3500 words (exceptions considered on a case-by-case basis).
- Co-authorship: Allowed (maximum of two authors).
- Citation Style: OSCOLA 4th edition (No hyperlinks).
- Formatting: Garamond, Font Size: 12 (body), 10 (footnotes), Line Spacing: 1.5 (body), 1 (footnotes).
- Originality: Submissions must be unpublished and free from plagiarism.

- Submit your manuscript in .doc/.docx format via email to cpil@gnlu.ac.in.
- The subject line should be: "Submission for GNLU-CPIL Magazine Volume I, Issue II".
- The body of the email must include the author's name, affiliation, academic qualifications, and contact details.

REVIEW & PUBLICATION PROCESS

- The review period is approximately 6-8 weeks after deadline.
